- ★ Upcycle! Just about everything around your home can be creatively reused and given new life. Check out Recyclart for some awesome inspiration.
- ★ Don't throw away furnishings or appliances, and consider buying second-hand before you buy new. Like the saying goes, one man's trash is another man's treasure. Sites like Freecycle and Craigslist let you post your goods for free, so someone else can give them a loving home.
- ★ Try growing your own mini-garden. You don't need a ton of space, just a few containers, some good dirt, seeds, and a little patience! Get creative with your containers and reuse old cans, tires, or buckets, and check out tips from You Grow Girl and No Dig Vegetable Garden for gardening in small spaces.
- ★ If your old clothes are too dingy to donate, don't throw them away! Use them around the house cut up soft tees and pajamas to make dust rags, use 'em to stuff a dog bed, or stitch a bunch of old (read: sentimental) tee's together to make a quilt.
